The Cross and Son of Man Lifted Up

John 3:14-16 Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him." For

God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. John 12 32 "And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to Myself."

As humans, we have the tendency to lift up ourselves, convictions, families, interests, religions, politics, countries, banners, races and cultures up higher than any other. We would

rather have people become subservient to what we hold dear and do it by manipulation and coercion if the way of love, compassion and mercy seems difficult to follow through. One way to introspect during this Easter time is perhaps, to look at some of the things we

are passionate about, things we lift high up and fight for and see what and who it promotes.

Recently, as Liz Delafield was preaching at

Altrincham United Reformed Church, she brought about a number of portraits of God and Jesus Christ from the internet and she asked people which of the portraits they would pick and why. That was very inspiring and thought-provoking, because in our journey of faith and way of church, the portrait of God and Jesus Christ we tend to lift and project to ourselves, and probably for others, speaks volumes about what our deepest convictions are and how

our faith was formed, nurtured and groomed.

Easter time is presenting for us the need to reflect on the way we have been lifting the Son of Man on the cross to mark the manner in which he died, through our proclamation of

Perhaps, we have lifted the Cross the other way round and it became a sword with which we use to subdue and conquer other on the pretext of the gospel. Maybe, we have lifted the tree with both the serpent and the Son of Man alongside each other and people cannot tell exactly what gospel we are proclaiming. By the serpent, alongside the Son of Man it means pushing any other convictions, cultural, religious, political, economic, and scientific, and offering them as competing alternatives for the salvation of mankind beside the redemptive work accomplished by God through the life, ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Lastly, let us also be encouraged that we interrogate the portrait of Christ we may like seeing hanging on the Cross we are lifting. We should ascertain whether or not it is offensive to our common humanity because maybe it subtly celebrates legacies of injustice, and a culture of dominating others.

Now comes Easter; in which way will we lift the cross, what portrait of the Son of Man will we lift, and how will it draw people to it?



Minutes of Church Meeting

The Church Meeting was held on 3rd March 2024.

Welcome – Stuart Young (chairman) opened the meeting with a few words from Corinthians which refers to us all belonging to one body with many parts. We are all part of a sharing community which is decreasing in numbers .Volunteering is quite a commitment but we do need help in order to keep moving forward. A plea for help in any capacity was made. This was followed by an opening prayer.

30 members were present along with 1 adherent.

Minutes- The minutes of the church meeting held on 3rd December 2023 were approved and signed.

Matters Arising - None

Financial Statement for 2023- Joe James presented a statement of financial activities for the year ending 31st December 2023. Copies were distributed to those attending.

Income There are two areas of funding

- 1. Unrestricted
- 2. Restricted. The only restricted funds we have, are for the payment of the Mission Worker's salary.

Joe went on to explain some of the notes on page 4 of the statement.

Income

1. Collections and Donations. These came to £39,073 although giving was down (fewer members) but donations were up. 2022 showed a similar income of £38,176.

Tom Swan was thanked for his work in doing the tax return for the Inland Revenue which gives us our tax rebate on giving. And also for his advice to Joe.

- 2. Other Activities Room hire was up to £19,341 from £14,866 in 2022 Sue Vernon was thanked for all her hard work in doing so well with bookings. This is a 30% growth. Total income from other all activities was £20,421
- 3. **Investments** Interest on these stand at £2,704 up from £1,967in 2022, due to better interest rates.

Total Income This came to **£62,198** down from £76,484 in 2022.

Expenditure

1. **Ministry M&M** came to £27,588, down from £36,336 in 2022 due to falling numbers. Along with pulpit supply the total came to £30,943. In addition was the designated Mission Worker's salary of £13,475 up from £7,200 in

2022 partly due to back payments which were owed. Overall total ministry spend was £44,418

- 2. **Church** £21,081 was spent down from £80,896 in 2022. (No large capital spends) This coming year the roof may lead to more expenditure going forward.
- 3. **Charitable Giving** This was in line with 2022 coming in at £4,072

Total Expenditure This was **£69,57**1 (£131,757 in 2022)

Total Unrestricted Funds These stand at £62,198. £12.000 was drawn down from Synod Mission Fund. With the movement of funds and in interest on investments a net profit of £172 was shown for the year.

Total funds carried forward came to £182,970

Joe gave an explanation of our assets which do not include the church buildings which are in the name of U.R.C. trustees. 2 years of Manse funds are still available. A query was raised as to why the fund decreased by £35,000 in 2022 when it is only meant for a mission salary. Joe is going to look into it.

Joe was thanked for all his hard work. As he is stepping down at the end of this year we will need to appoint a new Treasurer. A church must have a nominated Treasurer. Joe has done a terrific job over the years and the meeting thanked him.

- 2. **Woodford Summer Festival** (organised by the Woodford community. C.T.iB.W have been asked to man a stall and hand out leaflets about all the churches 'activities.
- 3. **The Mill** It is now not being used very much. The 2 part time workers have also left so relies on volunteers. .Now C.T.iB.W are looking at its future prospects. Has the need now gone? There is a thriving' Christians in School' group at Bramhall High School .Do we perhaps move all the activities there?

Partnership News

- 1. **Ordination Service** Steph will be ordinated on Saturday 28th September at Gatley.
- 2. **Manses** Pastor K's manse is still going through in the Heatons. This now the third property they've gone for through no fault of theirs or Synod

Steph's family have looked at a prospective manse in Cheadle Hulme. Hopefully this can be completed by September.

3. **Money from Altrincham** The Steering Group is drawing up an action plan for the use of the monies donated by Altrincham U.R.C..

- 1. Community Audit. Elaine has a meeting this month with them, to look at what is going on outside the churches in the local community. Where could we join in?
- 2. **Maundy Service** This will be held at 8pm. at Cheadle Hulme URC.
- 3. Joint Meeting with Cheadle Hulme. and Heald Green to Discuss the Future. All agree joining together would be a good idea but no one is prepared to give up their church. We could hold more joint services and events together but we must be prepared to travel to the other churches. The other two churches bring more people to services at our church, than we send to theirs.
- 4. **Rucksack Appeal** This is ongoing throughout Lent and is for Wellspring

What's the Big Idea? An Introduction to the Books of the Bible

This month we consider Deuteronomy & Joshua

The setting for these books is Israel's entry into the promised land after 40 years of



wanderings in the wilderness. Deuteronomy gives us Moses' addresses on the plains of Moab, as the Israelites prepare to enter Canaan. The book of Joshua recounts the crossing of the Jordan and the victories that give the people control of Canaan.

The theme of Deuteronomy is God's covenant and his call for His people's obedience, loyalty and love. The 'shema' (Heb: 'hear'), expresses this response to God: 'Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be'

The book contains instruction on how to live intentionally as God's people in response to His love and mercy. Total loyalty to God is also crucial, with the worship of any other gods being totally rejected. It is also widely quoted in the NT eg. Jesus' temptations (Deut. 8:3, 6:13, 16).

The book of Joshua, with its description of the conquest of the land and the destruction of cities and peoples, reminds us that God's love and purposes for us are worked out in the messes, storms and sins of our daily lives. As God says Joshua: 'Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go.' (Joshua 1:9).

Joshua ('The Lord saves') is the same name as Jesus Himself. Jesus overcame all powers of evil to bring God's people into their eternal 'rest' (Heb 4:1–11).




