Being People of Safety and Solidarity this Easter

As we journey through Lent towards Easter, the gospel stories we share on Sundays highlight the many risks and dangers in discipleship. We hear again and again of the challenges the disciples

went through in following Christ, and the difficult nature of the path Christ was walking in obedience to God. Think of the two who were sent to take stranger's donkey for

Jesus to ride into Jerusalem, those who witnessed him being arrested in the Garden of Gethsemane, Peter being put on the spot about his allegiance to Christ, and the women who stayed with Christ at the cross when everyone else had left him. Every step Jesus took was fraught with danger, pain, and tears. Religious, social and political power were stacked against him. It was so risky for anyone to identify with Christ.

There are many people in our communities and world that are hurting right now. Those in situations of danger who, like Christ, know rejection, oppression, persecution, and the deep pain of being abandoned by those they once trusted. This Easter let us find ways that



we can be people and places of safety and solidarity in our troubled world. Through the welcome and friendship we offer, through prayer, through speaking out

against injustice, and through giving what we can in time or money to support those in need. Let us be sustained and inspired by the living hope and peace of the resurrected Christ, who came and endured so much so that all may 'have life and have it abundantly' (John 10:10).

Minutes of Church Meeting 23rd February 2025

Welcome – Stuart Young (chairman) welcomed everyone to the meeting. This was followed by a prayer.



27 members were present plus 2 on Zoom along with 1 adherent

Minutes - The Minutes of the Church Meeting held on 17th November 2024 were approved and signed.

Matters Arising - None

Financial A.G.M. - Joe James

Joe talked through the accounts for 2024

Income This totalled £72,305.

It was made up of Giving £33,554, Room Hire $\pounds 25,349$ and Other $\pounds 13,402$. It was the best year ever for room hire and Sue Vernon was thanked once again for her tremendous efforts. Tom Swan was also thanked for his work on Gift Aid and Tax Returns which brought in £8,067.

Expenditure This totalled £74,482 comprising of: Ministry £44,424, Church £27,455 and Donations £2,603. The roof problems have caused more maintenance costs and is ongoing. .M&M is increasing despite our numbers decreasing as we have to pay a contribution on our assets of 2.5%.

This gives an overall deficit of £2,177 for the year.

Investments/assets total £102,436 along with £11,385 owed to us from the Manse Scheme and cash. This gives us total funds carried forward of £180,793. Joe warned that the Mission Fund is decreasing year on year. If no record can be found for the use of the Restricted Legacy Fund, this money could be transferred to the general fund.

Joe also mentioned that the value of the buildings had increased greatly from around $\pounds 2.5$ million in 2023 to $\pounds 3.3$ million in 2024.

Joe was thanked for his 13 years of service as Treasurer and presented with some bottles of wine.

Where Did Your Easter Egg Come From?



Your Easter egg can be traced back to the early Church in Mesopotamia.

Since ancient times, people had been giving each other eggs at pagan Spring festivals, as eggs were a symbol of the new life and rebirth in nature all around them. Then came Jesus and His death and resurrection, which made Easter the ultimate time for Christians to celebrate new life and rebirth. After that, it was only a matter of time before eggs found their way into commemorating Easter.

This seems to have first happened with the very early church in Mesopotamia, where those early Christians began dyeing their eggs after Easter, to celebrate the new birth that Jesus had given to them. The practise of using eggs in Easter celebrations then spread to the Orthodox Churches, and from there to the Western Churches across Europe.

The readings may not always correspond with those chosen by our preachers, but this information could be used for personal reading.




